Work-order of the Coordination Committees' on the "Excellence Award in Teaching at Yerevan State University"

- 1. While exercising its authority defined by the YSU Rector's order 221/120 on 27 November, 2019, the Coordination Committee (hereafter Committee) on nomination of "Excellence Award in Teaching at Yerevan State University" operates in accordance with the above-mentioned order of YSU Rector and the current work-order.
- 2. The Committee holds sessions aimed at carrying out activities on candidates' nominations, winner's selection and other organizational tasks. The Committee session is authorized to adopt resolutions if 2/3 of the list members are present. The decisions are made by the votes of present members with the principle of simple majority.
- 3. Based on the Contest results the Committee makes one of the following decisions:
 - a) Selects the winner and confers the award
 - b) Regards the Contest as failed
 - c) Acknowledges no winner in the Contest
- 4. The Committee's decisions on the Contest winners are not a subject to publication until the day of the award ceremony.
- 5. The Committee members are informed on convening a recurrent session not late than 3 working days before, whereas notification on a special session is sent not late than 1 hour prior. The information on the Committee sessions is delivered to members by telephone or e-mail. Upon decision of the Committee the session proceedings are recorded.
- 6. The Committee may conduct observation of the winner's class activities in an unanticipated manner. The Committee may decide to involve experts in the class observations. The observations and their analysis are done by interpreting the outcomes of the *class evaluation checklist* provided in Appendix 1.
- 7. The candidates are assessed by the system of 100 points based on the nominations' standards described below:
